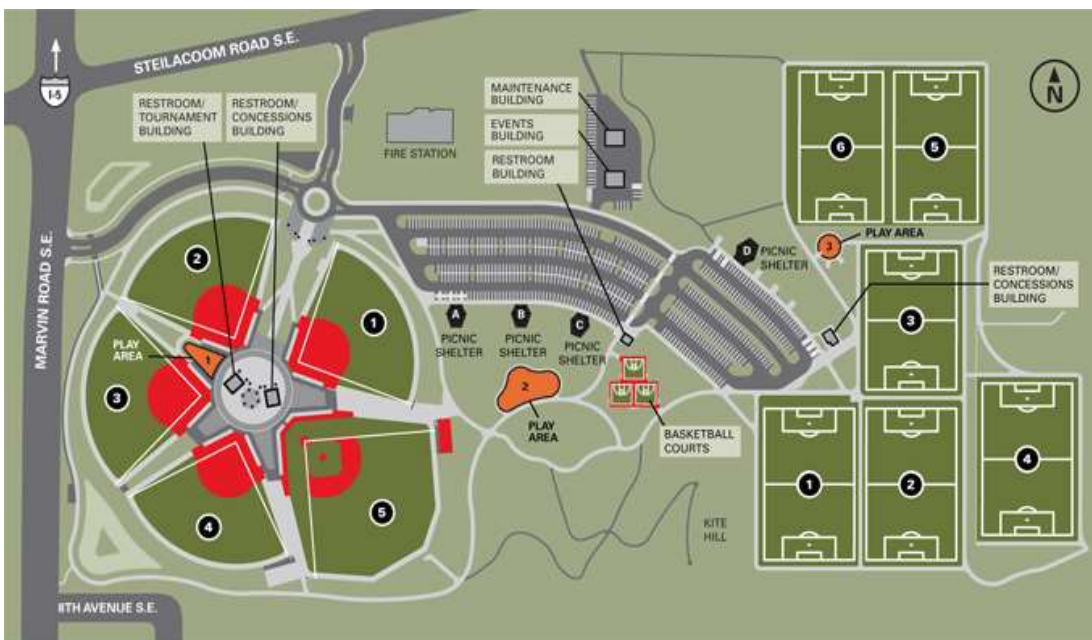


From I-5 Southbound (from Seattle / Tacoma)

Take Exit 111 Marvin Road NE. Turn left at the top of the ramp onto Marvin Road NE. Go 1.2 miles. At traffic signal, turn left onto Steilacoom Road SE. Then turn right into the main gate.

From I-5 Northbound (from Olympia / Portland)

Take Exit 111 Marvin Road NE (southbound). From the right exit lane, bear right onto Galaxy Drive NE. Turn left onto Martin Way E. Turn right onto Marvin Road SE. Go 0.6 mile. At traffic signal, turn left onto Steilacoom Road SE. Then turn right into the main gate.

After registering, you will receive a confirmation email containing information about joining the meeting.

The head coach of each team should check in at tournament headquarters to get their team packet up arrival at the facility.

IN PERSON COACHES MEETING

The tournament manager will have a folder for each coach as well as several announcements pertaining to the facility. Please plan to be at the tournament headquarters 1 hour prior to your first scheduled game of the tournament to participate in a brief in-person meeting.

ADDITIONAL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Metal Cleats

Metal cleats **will not be permitted on artificial surfaces at the RAC.**

Infield Practice

Each team will be provided 5 minutes of infield practice on the game field for the first-round games and trophy rounds only. **The home team takes the infield first.** No teams are to be on the fields until the ground crew has completed preparing the field for the game. For all other games, no infield, but pitchers and catchers can be on the infield after the field has been prepared with pitchers throwing out away from home plate on their respective baseline.

Awards

The Awards ceremony will take place immediately following the consolation and championships games. The Academic State Championship Team Award will be presented prior to the Championship game on Saturday, or other time at the request of the school.

Opening Ceremony and National Anthem

Prior to games #1-#12 all teams will stand on their basepath, participate in the National Anthem and then team introductions.

Tournament Headquarters

The Tournament Headquarters will be housed in the tournament building within the RAC concourse.

Line-Up Cards

Line-up cards will be provided at the coaches meeting and are available at the tournament building. The tournament will provide official scorekeeper and scoreboard operators for all games.

Selection of Home Team

Home and visiting teams will be designated on the draws for the first round of play. The tournament manager or designee will conduct a coin toss for all succeeding rounds with the two coaches to determine the home team – one (1) hour before game time. The winner of the coin toss will have the choice of being home or visiting team. The visiting team will choose their dugout.

Game Balls

Each school must furnish its own warm-up balls. Game balls will be provided. All foul balls and homeruns are property of the WIAA.

Continuing Suspended Game

Any game that is interrupted with teams having played less than the required number of innings to be considered a regulation game according to NFHS rules will be continued from the point of suspension. The tournament manager shall determine when the game will be completed. The line-up and batting order of each team shall be exactly the same as the line-up and batting order at the moment of suspension, subject to the rules governing the game.

Postponed Games

When necessary to postpone any tournament game, it shall be the responsibility of the tournament manager to re-schedule according to WIAA policy (refer to Inclement Weather Policy in General Tournament Regulations). The tournament manager shall have a plan for rainouts worked out in advance. The manager shall keep everyone informed including the WIAA office. Postponed games may be played on Sunday.

Tie Breaker Procedure

The NFHS tie breaker procedure will be implemented after **eight (8) full innings** have been played. Each subsequent half-inning begins by placing a runner on second base. That runner is the player in the batting order who precedes the lead-off batter in that inning. Then the game proceeds to a full inning or until a winner is determined in that inning.

Run Rule

The ten-run rule will be in effect after **five (5)** innings have been played.

Home Run Fence

The Home Run fence will be set at 210-feet.

Music / Noisemakers - Teams

No music is allowed to be played by teams inside the facility.

Practice

The RAC facility is **available** for team practices the afternoon/evening prior to the tournament. Please contact Aaron Roetcisoender (aaron@wiaa.com) before Wednesday, May 24th to reserve a practice slot. During the tournament Field #5 will be shared by teams for additional practice and warmups. There are other open areas throughout the park that provide teams areas for set-up. Please, no teams are to be behind the fences when games are live.

Photography

[Northwest Sports Photography](#) will take team and action photos during the tournament. All teams should have a team

picture taken but a purchase is not required.

Souvenirs

Team and action photographs (4nsp.com), programs (wiaa.com), and tournament merchandise (rushteamapparel.com) will be on sale throughout the tournament.

Trainer

There will be certified athletic trainers on duty for the entire tournament, however each school needs to supply their own medical supplies. Ice and general care will be available for emergency use.

TEAMS ONLY, will be allowed to bring coolers into the complex.

Ticket Prices

The WIAA has transitioned to paperless ticketing with WIAA State Tournament tickets available for purchase digitally through GoFan, the WIAA's ticketing partner. Fans will have the ability to purchase digital tickets onsite by using their mobile devices. SERVICE FEES APPLY.

Officials

Washington Officials Association (WOA) certified softball officials will be assigned to each contest. Officials are selected by their association to work at this tournament and are assigned by the WIAA/Umpire In Charge.

Official Scorer

The tournament will have an official scorer on each field.

YOUTH SUPPORT OF TEAM

Effective with the 2021-22 year, the WIAA will not allow any students younger than high school age to participate in supporting roles at a WIAA State Championship unless the parent/guardian signs a waiver ahead of time and acknowledges they assume all risk. The WIAA's catastrophic insurance does not cover these younger students so they assume all risk related to injury. Such roles include student trainers, student managers, student coaches, student scorekeepers, student bat and ball boys/girls, student water boys/girls, etc.

Note: A school cannot sign a WIAA waiver on behalf of an individual - all WIAA waivers MUST be signed by the parent/guardian of the minor.

See attached waiver. A copy of the waiver must be provided to the tournament manager PRIOR to any games where this applies. In addition, schools need to keep a copy of the waiver with them at all times during the event.

CROWD CONTROL

Crowd control is the responsibility of the participating school supervisors. It is important that building administrators provide game supervision in the stands by promoting a safe enjoyable event for everyone. Please remind students to wear shirts, and to observe the WIAA Tournament policy. **NO ARTIFICIAL NOISE MAKERS ARE ALLOWED including music inside the facility.** If an issue with one of your students arises, we will ask you to address it.

SIGNS & SCHOOL BANNERS

NO signs other than the OFFICIAL SCHOOL BANNER will be allowed. Please inform your crowd and spectators.

BRACKETS

The 2023 Softball brackets are available on the WIAA website – www.wiaa.com or the WIAA Live App. An updated bracket will be displayed on-site and will be presented to the champion of each classification as part of the post-game awards ceremony.

RADIO AND TELEVISION COVERAGE

Stations wishing to broadcast or televise the match must have the prior approval of the WIAA

STREAMING

It is the goal of the WIAA that all games from the state tournament will be streamed live on the NFHS Network and available for viewing on-demand. **Schools and fans are prohibited from streaming or recording of any kind during or after the tournament.** Any such action is a direct violation of WIAA/NFHS media rights and will not be allowed. AUTHORITY OF DESIGNATED TOURNAMENT PHYSICIANS - The Association or other sponsoring authority may designate a tournament physician and assistant tournament physicians or another designated medical authority to provide medical coverage/services for specific tournaments under its sponsorship. The tournament physicians shall have final responsibility for medical decisions at the tournament, consulting with assistant tournament physicians and team physicians or other designated medical authority as appropriate. The tournament physician (and assistant tournament physician or designated medical authority when they are on the scene in the absence of the tournament physician) shall have the following authority in addition to that normally associated with the practice of medicine and surgery:

1. To determine whether an injured participant may continue in the contest. The decision against further participation may not be overturned by a coach, official, parent, another physician, or any other person. If an injured participant has a team physician present, consultation between the tournament manager and team physicians is expected when time permits, prior to the decision.
2. To provide medical coverage/services to tournament participants as requested.
3. To interrupt a contest if, in the opinion of the tournament physician, continuation would pose a significant threat to the safety, health, or life of a competitor, due to an injury to said competitor.
4. To enter the field of competition as necessary to fulfill his/her duties.
5. To supervise the activities of paramedical personnel who may be involved in the conduct of the tournament.
6. To serve as advisor to the tournament director on medical, health, and safety matters related to the tournament.
