DIRECTIONS TO KIWANIS PARK

Kiwanis Park is located about three blocks north of the SunDome on Fair Avenue. From the north on I-82, take exit 33A and at the light turn left onto Fair Ave, proceed to Maple Street and turn left to Kiwanis Park. From the south on I-82 take exit 34, turn left onto Nob Hill Blvd, turn right at Fair Ave (second light), and continue on Fair Ave (through the light), and turn right on Maple St.

DIRECTIONS TO THE PASS GATE

All vehicles transporting players, coaches, supervisors, school board members, etc. should turn on Beech Street, which is one block south of Maple Street. Follow the signs to the parking area. **NO ENTRANCE at the main ticket gate for people with passes. Please inform your administrators, etc. as to the location of the pass gate.**

ADDITIONAL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Home Team

For the first round only, the home team is listed on the bottom of the tournament bracket. For all succeeding rounds, the Umpire-in-Chief or designee will conduct a coin toss with representatives from each team. The winner of the coin toss will have the choice of being home or visitor. **The coin toss will be conducted 30 minutes prior to game time at the tournament manager's table** (located at the picnic shelter).

Infield Practice

Each team is allowed five (5) minutes on the tournament playing field prior to the first round of games and the championship round only. The home team will take infield practice first.

Youth Support of the Team

Effective with the 2021-22 year, the WIAA will not allow any students younger than high school age to participate in supporting roles at a WIAA State Championship unless the parent/guardian signs a waiver ahead of time and acknowledges they assume all risk. The WIAA's catastrophic insurance does not cover these younger students so they assume all risk related to injury. Such roles to include student trainers, student managers, student coaches, student scorekeepers, student bat and ball boys/girls, student water boys/girls, etc.

Note: A school cannot sign a WIAA waiver on behalf of an individual - all WIAA waivers MUST be signed by the parent/guardian of the minor.

See attached waiver. A copy of the waiver must be provided to the tournament manager PRIOR to any games where this applies. In addition, schools need to keep a copy of the waiver with them at all times during the event.

Line-Up Cards

Line-up cards will be provided at the coaches meeting. Each coach must deliver his/her batting order on the line-up cards to the umpire with the **top white sheet going to the official scorekeeper**. Please list **first and last names** and positions on the line-up card.

Trainer

A certified athletic trainer will be on duty for the entire tournament. **Each school must supply its own medical supplies**, including tape. Ice will be available.

Sportsmanship

Sportsmanship medallions may be awarded to individuals, teams, fans, support personnel at the completion of each game. Sportsmanship medallions will not be presented during trophy games.

Awards

Awards will be presented immediately following the consolation and championship games. The Academic State Championship award will be presented prior to the 4pm games on Saturday. If the Academic State Champion is a tournament participant, **the award may be presented prior to the team's first consolation game, whichever occurs first.**

Streaming

It is the goal of the WIAA that all games from the state tournament will be streamed live on the NFHS Network and available for viewing on-demand. Schools and fans are prohibited from streaming or recording of any kind during or after the tournament. Any such action is a direct violation of WIAA/NFHS media rights and will not be allowed. Live streams for WIAA State events can be found on the [NFHS Network](#). Gamechanger may be used to live score the games, but video streaming is not allowed.

Photography

[Northwest Sports Photography](#) will take team and action photos during the tournament. All teams should have a team picture taken but a purchase is not required.

Souvenirs

Team and action photographs ([4nsp.com](#)), programs ([wiaa.com](#)), and tournament merchandise ([rushteamapparel.com](#)) will be on sale throughout the tournament.

Illegal Entry

Anyone attempting to enter Gateway Sports Complex with a fraudulent pass will be denied entry and may be subject to criminal trespass arrest. Anyone found with a fraudulent pass inside the facility will be removed and will be subject to criminal trespass arrest.

AUTHORITY OF DESIGNATED TOURNAMENT PHYSICIANS - The Association or other sponsoring authority may designate a tournament physician and assistant tournament physicians or another designated medical authority to provide medical coverage/services for specific tournaments under its sponsorship. The tournament physicians shall have final responsibility for medical decisions at the tournament, consulting with assistant tournament physicians and team physicians or other designated medical authority as appropriate. The tournament physician (and assistant tournament physician or designated medical authority when they are on the scene in the absence of the tournament physician) shall have the following authority in addition to that normally associated with the practice of medicine and surgery:

1. To determine whether an injured participant may continue in the contest. The decision against further participation may not be overturned by a coach, official, parent, another physician, or any other person. If an injured participant has a team physician present, consultation between the tournament manager and team physicians is expected when time permits, prior to the decision.
2. To provide medical coverage/services to tournament participants as requested.
3. To interrupt a contest if, in the opinion of the tournament physician, continuation would pose a significant threat to the safety, health, or life of a competitor, due to an injury to said competitor.
4. To enter the field of competition as necessary to fulfill his/her duties.
5. To supervise the activities of paramedical personnel who may be involved in the conduct of the tournament.
6. To serve as advisor to the tournament director on medical, health, and safety matters related to the tournament.
